

Dear Reader,

This companion CD to Volume IV provides copies of all comment documents submitted on the draft PEIS, as well as transcripts of the public comment meetings that were held on the draft PEIS. To view the comment documents, you should open the folder titled “Volume IV Zip Files” and then open the folder titled “WWEC PEIS Volume IV.zip.” Depending on the software and operating system used by your computer to unzip the folder, you will either see three folders (“Table 1 and 2 Comments,” “The Wilderness Society,” and “WFOA”) or the comment documents listed simply as individual files.

The file names for the comment documents submitted by the individuals and organizations listed in Tables 1 and 2 in Volume IV of the final PEIS begin with either “WWEC-Comments” or “WWEC-Hearing” to indicate whether they contain individual comment documents or the transcripts of public comment meetings, respectively. For example, the file “WWEC-Comments_50550-50567” includes the 18 individual comment documents with identification numbers from 50550 to 50567. Files containing transcripts of public hearings include the name of the city where the public comment meeting was held. For example, the file “WWEC-Hearing_Window_Rock” includes all oral or written comment documents presented at the public comment meeting held in Window Rock, AZ.

To view a specific comment document (and its associated comments) submitted by a commentor listed in Table 1 or 2, you should first locate the comment document identification number for the commentor of interest within Table 1 or Table 2. Next, note whether the identification number consists solely of numbers or starts with capital letters. If the identification number consists solely of numbers, then the corresponding comment document will be found among the “WWEC-Comments” files. If the identification number begins with capital letters, the corresponding comment document will be found among the files named “WWEC-Hearing.”

To view a specific comment document having an identification number consisting solely of numbers, look for the file whose name consists of “WWEC-Comments” and the range of numbers that includes the identification number of interest. You should then open that file and scroll down until the comment document of interest is found.

To view a specific comment document having an identification number that begins with capital letters, refer to the table below, which relates the letter codes to the cities they stand for. A comment document with an identification number that begins with AZP, for example, corresponds to the “WWEC-Hearing” file pertaining to Phoenix, AZ. The specific comment document of interest will be found by scrolling down this file.

The Wild Horse Observers Association (WHOA) submitted comment documents that reside in 15 files whose file names begin with “WHOA.” Patience O’Dowd of WHOA submitted the documents, and these comment documents (letters and/or survey forms) from the members of WHOA are identified in Table 3 of Volume IV of the final PEIS. To find a letter or form from an individual, you should first locate the comment document identification number for the commentor of interest in Table 3 in Volume IV of the final PEIS. You should then find the file that begins with “WHOA” that includes that

comment identification number. Finally, you should open the file and scroll down until the comment document of interest is found.

The comment letters submitted by the members of The Wilderness Society listed in Table 4 in Volume IV of the final PEIS are bundled in 28 separate files; the names were not alphabetically organized within these files. To find a comment letter from an individual member of The Wilderness Society, you should open a file, select “Edit” in the file menu at the top of the page, and then select “Find.” You should then type in the name of the individual of interest and hit “Enter.”
