



We and others in Placitas, as well as others around the state, are working in conjunction with WHOA to ensure that we find common ground in the effort to find win-win solutions for our variety of concerns regarding the Placitas BLM.


With this letter we join the Common Grounds Coalition (now named the Placitas Coalition) with WHOA and the State of New Mexico (via their support, and their representative's unanimous votes for SM2 in 2006 and SJM08 in 2007) to keep the wild horses on the BLM in Placitas and other surrounding areas of Placitas. As such **we would like to keep the 5000 acre BLM property in Placitas as a wildlife/wild horse park.**

Moreover, we and other residents from throughout all the different parts of Placitas have effectively worked in conjunction with WHOA in an informal coalition for at least the last two years and to wit, we have installed 4.5 miles of fencing. This coalition encompass' many if not most Placitans through their donations (\$25,000 in 2 yrs) and has been proactive on safety issues as well as speaking to our concerns legislatively. Through these efforts we have installed \$50,000 worth of safety fencing proactively for the community of Placitas, the BLM, and the Albq Open Space combined.

As far as all the other concerns, ATV's, mining, target practice, etc. these are not what we prefer, but **we will be working on our own and in conjunction with this coalition to find compromise positions as needed to keep the Placitas BLM an open space for all to enjoy, from humans to wild horses to the bobcats.**
