



Through these efforts we have installed \$50,000 worth of safety fencing proactively for the community of Placitas, the BLM, and the Albuquerque Open Space combined.

As far as all the other concerns, ATV's, mining, target practice, etc. these are not what we prefer, but **we will be working on our own and in conjunction with this coalition to find compromise positions as needed to keep the Placitas BLM an open space for all to enjoy, from humans to wild horses to the bobcats.**
