**Comment Submitted:**

Regarding the PEIS: How will energy transmission through energy corridors affect tribal lands and the protection of tribal consent relating to renegotiation of land leases, compensation or energy development for tribal nations?  
How concerned will the PEIS be on protecting Title V, the "Indian Tribal Energy Development and Self-Determination Act" of the Energy Policy Act of 2005? How will section 1813 identify the importance of tribal influence in determining energy transmission through tribal lands? Eventually, is it possible that when developing new energy corridors; "the Agencies- DOI, USDA, DOD, DOE" will simply seek authorization from the secretary of Indian affairs and not from tribal nations themselves?  
How can the PEIS protect tribal right of consent? How can the PEIS protect the process of mutual negotiation, fairness and respect for tribes. How can the PEIS protect the promise of retained tribal sovereignty that Congress has made to the tribes?
