Comment Submitted: On behalf of Shell Oil Company, I would like to express our support for the ongoing development of a Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement (PEIS) to establish West-wide Energy Corridors. We have reviewed the recently released preliminary corridor maps and believe these routes are reasonable and will likely assist in permitting future projects to provide energy to our nation's population. We would also like to clarify and emphases a few important points as work on the PEIS begins.

We assume the corridors will only apply to future pipelines and that there is no intention that any existing lines be relocated to these corridors.
It is important that the corridors will completely connect important hub

centers/destinations such that there will be a continuous route.
 The corridors should provide for crossing Native American Tribal Lands

• If the rights of way in the corridors will not be perpetual in duration, some provision for renewals should be made.

• While we understand that the corridors will be the preferred sites for new pipelines we believe that other locations outside of the corridor system should also be able to be considered for approval on specific projects.
