I am writing this comment to encourage you to add the oil movement corridor from Baker, Montana to Guernsey, Wyoming included in the scope of the the West-wide Energy Corridor Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement (PEIS) that is currently in the public comment period. In reviewing the scope I noticed the Butte Pipeline/Belle Fouche Pipeline corridor from Baker, Montana to Guernsey, Wyoming was not on the map displayed on the PEIS website. This very important oil movement route for Montana, North Dakota, and Wyoming crude is approaching capacity. This market has seen large price differentials relative to NYMEX, which directly effects royalty and severance tax payments to the BLM and local state governments. Because of the successful redevelopment of the Red River B zone on the Cedar Creek Anticline in Fallon County, Montana and the Bakken Shale play in Richland County, Montana, the Williston Basin volumes are growing significantly and new pipelines will need to be built to move that crude oil to market.
