- 1. Please extend the comment period by 30/60 more days.
- 2. The web site does not appear to contain the in depth technical data for the EIS? We request access to this information.
- 3. The map does not permit us to actually tell where the line goes with any accuracy at all, even a general area guess is hard. Are there better maps we can use. GIS would be best for us.
 - a. The pdf map appears to have capabilities to use, however, it's locked and can't be exported.
- 4. Appears to cross private property here and there. Seems this falls under Mono County siting/permitting jurisdiction.
- 5. The largest and most profitable industry in California is tourism. Mono/Inyo County has more annual visitors that Yellowstone and Yosemite combined. I hope the impact on tourism is closely analyzed. The path of least resistance from a line perspective might be counter productive in the long run to retaining the economic benefit of tourism. A great part of our tourism attraction is the vistas that overhead lines would go through.
