Comment Submitted:

Energy development is a priority area for renewable energy and bio-mass for alternative fuels. We are concerned that the Energy Policy Act, Section 1813 has been designed to disregard Tribal consent to right of ways. Historically, the cost of right of ways has been fair and in the past negotiated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs at a lower cost than across the fence deals. We intend to negotiate with energy companies in a free market environment. Energy development has an impact on fishm, wildlife and their habitats. Habitat loss, invasive weeds, disription of seasonal miigration routes and breeding activity, and increased predation may be caused by access roads, pipelines, power lines, transmission ststions, compressor noiuse, and the increase in traffic that accompanies such development. we recommend the PEIS evaluate these issues as wwell as analyze any impacts to fish and wildlife as a result of temporary facilities, access roads, and various other construction activities. If possible, include specific information regarding affected resources, project design, function, and would help to determine whether new or additional data are needed and, this information will help to determine wheether new or additional data re needed and, to determine the most appropriate study methodologies and data collection and analysis, and if they are not in conflict with our tribal priciples for right of ways studies.
