The proposed energy corridor in the Indian Springs area will be harmful to our community if the currently proposed route is followed.

Our community is beginning to expand with several builders having purchased land to build stick home developments. This is a first for Indian Springs. These projects have not yet reached building stage and I think the intrusion of the corridor is apt to be the end of the projects.

The current Nevada Power line that passes through Indian Springs was mistakenly put on private land that belongs to my mother, Virginia Dane. There is no legal easement for it. We do not want a corridor with additional public utilities put on this property.

The artisan well that is owned by the Fisher Ranch would also be impacted as well as many historic sites on that ranch.

Although it would involve more expense to put the line behind "Grandpa Mountain," given the overall price of the project, it would only be a blip on the radar screen, dollar-wise. The effect on Indian Springs to put it in the proposed location would be gigantic.

I would ask the big powers that be to consider doing something that is right for our little community.
