## Comment Submitted:

The Interstate Highway system should serve as the backbone for all corridors, with very few deviations.. As the Interstate system already connects urban centers, the corridors should only deviate from the Interstate system when absolutely necessary. This should make the corridors easier to secure, patro,l and access for service. Other Federal State and local roads and highways should NOT be used as corridors. Solar farms should be set up in the corridor space, and generate power to be fed into the grid.

Public lands are too valuable as natural resources and buffers to urban sprawl to be further denegrated by development.

All areas bordering on any parks, forests, farm land, ranch land, wetlands, natural attractions, animal ranges. Parks, forests, &c, should be avoided. These lands are vial to the future.

In general, the resources being transmitted should be used close to the point of origin whenever possible. Rangeland should not be disturbed, and ATV trails must not be an adjunct to or a use within corridors.
