I am writing in response to the public comment offering by the West-wide Energy Corridor Programmatic EIS Center regarding energy land use designations.

BP Pipelines North America, Inc. is the second largest liquids pipeline company in the U.S. transporting over 450 million barrel-miles of oil, refined products, natural gas liquids, carbon dioxide, and chemicals daily -- about 9 percent of the U.S. Liquids pipeline market. Beyond our core operations, we participate in various joint venture pipelines and operate several systems located in the 11 states currently under study for the PEIS. However, after a review of our current facilities we have not identified any corridor candidates.

While it is difficult to forecast the future needs of our organization to serve the changing markets, BP Pipelines will continue to work with all agencies to promote the use of corridors for energy facilities.
