While the undertaking of the three agencies is both necessary and desirable, it is by its very nature incomplete and therefore of limited value in analyzing the possible availability of new or enlarged energy corridors in the West. Unless lands managed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the National Park Service, and the Department of Defense are added to the analysis, decision makers will not have the complete picture of both the availability and restrictions on availability that current laws, regulations, and practices define.
